

Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:8)

"Deserves got nothing to do with it."

In the movie *Unforgiven*, Clint Eastwood's character, Bill Munny, was a cold-blooded killer. His line: "Deserves got nothing to do with it" means simply that what happens to us is not tied to whatever we think we are entitled to.

The universe deals out famine, epidemics, hurricanes and personal tragedy without a thought to what anyone deserves. Experience bears that out every day.

Children are killed by drunk drivers, innocent civilians are killed in military conflicts of which they want no part and the list goes on and on.

The flip side is also true. God freely gives us God's love no matter what we do.

Paul writes in Romans: "But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

Paul applies this concept to God's love for creation and the people God calls to make known that kind of love.

The world might appear to be hopelessly caught in a spiral of spiritual, environmental and political destruction.

The church might seem a far cry from the Body of Christ Paul insists that it is.

Neither the world nor the church seems worth God's investing so much of God's self.

But this world is the one for which God sent God's Son and the church is the people called and chosen to make that wonderful gift known. **"Deserves got nothing to do with** it."

Romans 5 focuses on Paul's central message of grace: that our life as God's children and heirs is not something we earn or deserve

by our righteousness, but is something God does for us out of love when

we do not deserve it.

"While we were still sinners, while we were still weak, Christ died for us."

In this way our whole identity as God's children is something we "received without payment"—Paul calls it "this grace in which we stand."

God's love was poured into our hearts, Paul writes, and that is both God's love for me and God's love overflowing from my heart to my neighbor.

Knowing that I did nothing to earn God's love, I let it flow to others without expecting them to earn it or to repay me.

While Jesus' life, death and resurrection is a new thing in the story of God's love for humankind, grace does not begin with Jesus.

Throughout all of the Bible, we read about God taking care of God's people. Not because of what the people did, but because of <u>who</u> <u>God is</u>. This is the grace in which we stand.

Enjoy summer, enjoy each day of summer and of each season! The best to all of you!


Layettes

2023 Synod Assembly

The 2023 Southwestern Minnesota Synod Assembly was held June 9 and 10 at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter. We met in person for the first time in four years. It was great to visit with people from around the synod.

Rich Isder and Pastor Kristine attended the assembly as voting members. This year, for the first time, the synod assembly went paperless.

The theme of the assembly was "Embody the Word".

The assembly started with workshops. Pastor Kristine



attended "Wait . . . Kids are People?" about incorporating children into worship services; and "Faithful Innovations in a Changing (Church) World" about changes in the church over time and in the future.

Opening worship was held in Christ Chapel which is always so inspiring with so many people participating and singing.

Speaker Matt Bloom's presentations led us to consider our own well-being as beloved children of God and the well-being of our churches in this changing time.

Rev. Kevin Jacobson gave the ELCA Churchwide Organization report.

Music was provided by Dakota Road.

Other actions of the assembly were to approve the 2024 Compensation Guidelines and the 2025 Synod Budget and election of synod council and committee positions. Maria Lokensgard was elected as vice president of the synod.

There was only one resolution:

to incorporate changes from the 2022 Churchwide Assembly into the Synod constitution. The resolution passed.

During the banquet Friday evening various clergy milestones and church milestones were recognized. Kviteseid was among the churches recognized for their 150th anniversary in 2022. AN ABUNDANCE OF GIFTS

In 2022, people set some amazing Guinness World Records. A Nebraska man paddled more than 37 miles in a hollowed-out pumpkin boat. A Vermont teen wearing 4-inch heels walked more than 600 feet across



a tightrope. And an Oregon man found and alphabetized all 26 letters in a can of alphabet soup in 2 minutes and 8.6 secm Gopp onds. (The toughest part, he says, is distinguishing subtle differences between letters such as M and W.)

Your talents might not earn you any world records, but they certainly can grow faith and change lives. Whether you're good at teaching, singing, writing, cooking or accounting, the church can put those skills to productive use. Romans 12 lists many more gualities you may not realize are spiritual gifts: graciousness, serving, generosity, acts of mercy, loving and honoring others, extending hospitality, rejoicing and weeping with people, making peace.

You might not be able to outperform the alphabet soup record. But God abundantly blesses each of us to "outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans 12:10, ESV) and in sharing his love.
