

#### Invitation to Lent

P Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

#### **CONFESSION OF SIN**

- P Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.
- Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination.
- P Most holy and merciful God,
- C we confess to you and to one another, and before the whole company of heaven, that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.
- P We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P We have shut our ears to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our past unfaithfulness, the pride, envy, hypocrisy, and apathy that have infected our lives, we confess to you.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, we confess to you.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to share the faith that is in us, we confess to you.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our neglect of human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, we confess to you.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you.
- C Have mercy on us, O God.

- P Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.
- C Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.

#### **IMPOSITION OF ASHES**

P Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be a sign of our mortality and penitence, reminding us that only by the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ are we given eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES**

Please come forward. Ashes will be placed on your forehead or, if you prefer, in the palm of your open hand, with the words of God to Adam:

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

(Children are invited to come forward with their parents.)

- Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation,
- C that we may show forth your glory in the world.
- P By the cross and passion of your Son, our Savior,
- C bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.
- P Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life.

#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

C Almighty God, while we were sinners, still bound by our sins and unable to free ourselves, you sent Jesus to save us. With his death and resurrection he defeated our enemies of sin, death and the devil. Through faith in his name, we have forgiveness for our sins and the gift of eternal life. During this season of Lent and always, help us to bear fruit in keeping with repentance so that others will see the love of Jesus reflected in our lives. # Ash Wednesday Worship

For this Ash Wednesday evening, those desiring the imposition of ashes will be ushered forward. Ashes will be placed on your forehead in the form of the cross or, if your prefer, in the palm of your open hand. Children are invited to come forward with their parents. Ashes will be administered with the words of God to Adam:

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

<u>Holy Communion</u>: We invite all those who are baptized to share this special meal of forgiveness and renewal. Children who do not commune may come forward for a blessing. Gluten free wafers and apple juice are available.

<u>Lenten Services</u>: In this worship series for Lent and Holy Week, "To Seek and To Save", we follow Jesus as he turns toward Jerusalem and the Cross. Walk in his footsteps, from the miracle of the raising of Lazarus to Jesus' own empty tomb on Easter morning. This was the purpose for which Jesus had come—to seek and to save the lost.

## March 2 - Ash Wednesday: Unbind Him

Today, Ash Wednesday, begins the 40-day season of Lent. We will receive the mark of ashes, a sign that we are sinners, but sinners redeemed by our Savior Jesus Christ. Just as Lazarus was released from his burial shroud, Jesus our Lord releases us from the bonds of sin that entangle us.

All Wednesday Lenten services will be joint with Kviteseid and Big Bend and held at 7:00 p.m. with supper at 6:00 p.m. We are, however, still looking for a group to serve supper March 23<sup>rd</sup>. If interested, please contact the Kviteseid church office.
