Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder

Have you heard about the new James Webb Space Telescope?

Webb will study the solar system and photograph stars and galaxies we didn't even know existed.

Webb was launched on December 25, 2021 and on January 24 arrived at its destination about a million miles from earth. The first image was released July 11.

"Today, we present humanity with a groundbreaking new view of the cosmos from the James Webb Space Telescope – a view the world has never seen before," said NASA Administrator Bill Nelson. "These images, including the deepest infrared view of our universe that has ever been taken, show us how Webb will help to uncover the answers to questions we don't even yet know to ask; questions that will

help us better understand our universe and humanity's place within it."

I read that there are many more stars in the universe than grains of sand on the earth. And now we will be able to see more of them. It's hard to imagine the scale of God's creation.

"Awareness of the divine begins with wonder." (Abraham Heschel)

In the words of "How Great Thou Art":

*O Lord my God!
When I in awesome wonder
Consider all the works
thy hand hath made,
I see the stars,
I hear the mighty thunder,
Thy power throughout
the universe displayed;*

*Then sings my soul,
my Savior God, to Thee,
How great Thou art,
how great Thou art!*

"The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork." (Psalm 19:1)

There are many references to stars in the Bible.

The first is in the first chapter of Genesis in the creation story: "God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth." (Genesis 1:16-17)

Another is the promise to Abraham: "God brought Abraham outside and said,

‘Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.’ Then he said to him, ‘So shall your descendants be.’” (Genesis 15:5)

As great as the stars revealed by the Webb, the love of God is greater. God’s grace stretches beyond the limits of light and time. The witness of the Bible and the lives of faithful believers are each a lens which together make clearer the grand truth of God’s goodness.

Wonder. Awe. That’s the response of seeing the pictures from the Webb telescope.





Kviteseid History Trivia - *continued from July*

How often were services held in the early days? Once a month.

When were the first baptisms? August 4, 1872. Two girls were baptized.

When was the first confirmation service? May 1874 when four people were confirmed.

Where were worship services held before the first church was built? At such places as the members found convenient, usually in members' houses. The place of the next meeting was decided at each service. Beginning about 1879, services were held at the schoolhouse near the present cemetery.

Who led the singing during worship in the early years of the church? A sexton or "Klokker". Later, when choirs were organized, it was their responsibility to lead the singing at the services. Hymnbooks brought from Norway were used. There were few instruments.

How long did the congregation worship without a church building? From 1872 to 1884.

When did construction start on the first church building? July 2, 1883. It was completed in 1884.

Project: Layettes

On September 11, we will be having God's Work Our Hands Sunday. One of our projects is putting together layettes. We hope to put together 20 layettes.

We are short some items. We need 12 new wash cloths, 12 new bath towels (52 inches long), 20 bars of ivory soap, and 12 pillow cases.

- Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units
- Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies
- Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws
- Establish ELCA churchwide policy
- Worship together
- Adopt a budget
- Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.

Church Council Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Council Minutes June 15, 2022

Members Present: Paul Tostenson, Josh Vetter, Erik Boraas, Bryan Schuerman, Cindy Kanten, Rich Isder, Char Strand, Jon Hanson, Stacey Lea, and Pastor Kristine Isder.

The meeting was called to order at 7:33 p.m. by Vice President Paul Tostenson.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes. Motion was made by Cindy Kanten, seconded by Jon Hanson, to approve the Secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: There was no treasurer's report, but we haven't had to borrow any funds yet this year.

Deacon's Report:

- There will be no Synod Assembly this year due to lack of quorum.
- The Milan All School Reunion Church Service was held at Kviteseid.
- Lakeside worship will be held July 3.
- Our worship time changes to 9:00 a.m. on July 10. This will be in effect for one year.
- We discussed a possible celebration of the 150th Anniversary of our church.
- Reed Molden and Jon Hanson will lead worship when Pastor Kristine is gone in July.

- We recommend no changes to the COVID protocol at this time.

Trustee's Report:

- Josh Vetter reported that we have received the geo-thermal bill. The rebates are still in place.
- There will be some landscaping done on the south side of the building.
- They are working on ideas for commercial gutters for the north and south sides of the building.

Board of Education: No report. VBS was scheduled for May, but it was canceled due to the May 12 storm.

Pastor's Report:

- Review of church attendance
- Worship time will change to 9:00 a.m. on July 10 and last through June 2023.
- Summer coffee will be after church in the narthex unless someone wants to use the basement.
- Four youth received first communion on Maundy Thursday, April 14. Four were confirmed on April 24. Four graduates were recognized on May 15.
- Road Ditch Cleanup was done on May 1.
- Syttende Mai Smorgas Tea was held on May 14.
- Lakeside worship was held on May 29. Kviteseid, Big Bend, Zion of Appleton, MN Valley, Borgund, and Immanuel were involved. 55 people attended. Loose offering of \$149 was sent to the area food shelves.
- Milan All School Reunion Community Worship was attended by

97 people. \$443 loose offering will be split between Kviteseid, The Milan Alumni Association, and area food shelves.

- The Synod Council will make the decisions that would have been made by the Synod Assembly.
- Video System: New chairs and tables have been installed. Jon Hanson and his family contributed them in memory of his mother.

Motion was made by Bryan Schuerman to approve all reports, seconded by Josh Vetter. Motion carried.

Old Business: No discussion.

New Business:

- We talked about possible celebration of 150th Anniversary. If it is held, we chose the date of September 25, 2022.
- God's Work, Our Hands Sunday will be held September 11, 2022.

Motion was made by Josh Vetter, seconded by Jon Hanson to adjourn the meeting at 7:59 p.m.

We closed the meeting by praying the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be September 21, 2022.
