Sharing the Peace

“The peace of Christ be with you always.”

“And also with you.”

Why do we share the peace during worship?

“The Peace” finds its roots in the writings of Apostles Peter and Paul. Both mention “kiss of peace”. (Don’t worry, we’re not going to kiss in church!)

Paul writes: “Agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you.” (2 Corinthians 13:11-12)

“The Peace” marks the transition from the preaching and teaching portion of the service to the service of Holy Communion.

Sharing the peace serves to reconcile worshipers to each other before the service of Holy Communion.

“The Peace” usually follows the prayers of the church and sums up the prayers: the peace of the risen Christ is the answer to our prayer, God’s gift to us all. The *you* is plural.

This greeting is the very peace by which Jesus greets his disciples following the resurrection.

“When it was evening on that day, Jesus came and stood among them and said, ‘Peace be with you.’ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said

to them again, ‘Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.’” (John 20:19-21)

The central exchange of peace is between the worship leader, speaking in Christ’s name, and the congregation. “The peace of Christ

be with you always.” The congregation responds, “And also with you.”

Following this greeting, the people greet and bless one another in the peace of the risen Christ.

This exchange is significant as a word from God to one another.

A gesture such as a handshake may accompany the words

“Peace be with you”.

Church Council Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Council Minutes December 28, 2022

*(postponed from
December 21, 2022)*

Members Present: Paul Tostenson, Sherry Norby, Josh Vetter, Bryan Schuerman, Cindy Kanten, Rich Isder, Char Strand, Jon Hanson, Stacey Lea, and Pastor Kristine Isder.

The meeting was called to order at 7:33 by Vice President Paul Tostenson.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes.

Treasurer's Report: As of 12/28/22, the church is \$39,000 in the black.

- \$7,200 will be sent to the Synod which will bring the yearly total to \$12,000.
- Between \$12,000-14,000 will be held back to start the new year.
- \$20,000 was put into the building fund for maintenance and repairs.

Deacon's Report:

- Big Bend Church will have two of the Lenten services.
- There will be no Communion on Palm Sunday this year due to so many Communion options during the month of April.
- Offering plates are starting to be passed during worship.

Trustee's Report:

- The new budget is \$10,000 higher than last year.

Board of Education: No report.

Pastor's Report:

- Worship attendance has been better this fall, ranging from 32 to 135 (Christmas program)
- Online worship is still 80-170 per Sunday. There were 170 viewers on Christmas Eve. With the weather conditions, several people couldn't attend in person.
- The 150th Anniversary celebration went well. There were 177 people in attendance.
- The Sunday School Christmas Program was very good.
- The Kviteseid Youth received contributions for Gifts of Love, which were then distributed to community members. They also received food shelf donations to help area families.
- The Micronesians used the church on December 3 for a funeral and also on December 25 and 26. There were no issues. They paid \$750 for this use of the church.
- Shaking hands for Sharing of the Peace has started, though people are hesitant to move around.
- In the newsletter, there is information about a one-year or a 61-day Bible Reading Program.

Motion by Char Strand, seconded by Jon Hanson, to approve all reports. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- Luther League Treasurer – No information

New Business:

- The Annual Meeting will be held Sunday, January 22, after church services. Lunch will be served following the meeting.

The next meeting will be held Wednesday, March 15, 2023, after the Lenten service.

Motion was made by Josh Vetter, seconded by Jon Hanson, to adjourn at 8:03 p.m. Motion carried.

Pastor Kristine led us the Lord's Prayer.

Excerpts from Bishop Dee Pederson's 2022 Annual Report

"For we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building." (1 Corinthians 3:9 NIV)

In this verse, Paul describes the church in beautiful images: as coworkers in God's service, a field, and a building! As we look ahead to 2023, I consider the image of the church as a field.

You are God's Field

The first thing I want to say is, **"Thank you!"** Thank you for planting God's Word in the world and loving your neighbors. Thank you for the generosity you share to further partner and synod ministries. Lay and rostered leaders are coworkers for God's mission. We lead and serve in our various congregational ministries believing and trusting that it is God who gives the growth. I give thanks to God for you!

Planted Together

Our synod identity statement says God has planted our congregations in cities, farms, and towns together under one prairie sky, and that by God's grace, together we have what we need. As I visit our congregations and listen to rostered and lay leaders, several things are clear:

- Like the earliest Christian communities, congregations today – from those in open country to larger cities and small towns - are very different from each other! Each congregation faces their own unique challenges and opportunities. And so this is a time to listen to one another's hopes and

concerns, seek to understand, and continue to remind each other that we are still in this together. *What does it mean to know that we as churches are connected to each other today?*

- God has given unique gifts to each congregation: the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23), and the gifts given to equip the saints for the work of ministry for building up the body of Christ. (Eph. 4:12). We are all partners because we are the body of Christ. *Whose gifts might you discover and lift up as you look to the new year?*
- Congregation identities have been shaped by the context in which God has planted us. We acknowledge that we cannot retreat to some of the nostalgia or habits of the past. *What is God calling you and your church to be and do in this new year?*
- Our context also provides important signposts as we consider how God is calling us into the future. Many congregations are partnering for new ministries of serving, faith formation, staffing, and worship. *How is the Spirit leading you to be the hands and feet and smile and love of Jesus with others in your area today?*

**"You happen to be God's field in which we are working."
(The Message).**

I give thanks for these partners in ministry who make us all better together:

- Pastoral staff: Synod Ministers Pr. Heather Culuris and Pr. Naomi Mahler; Director for Evangelical Mission (D.E.M.) Pr. Troy Pflibsen; and new Synod Youth Ministry Coordinator Pr. Nikoli Falenschek.
- I give thanks that we have celebrated ordinations and welcomed

13 new rostered ministers in 2022. As you see people in your congregation or community who you think have the gifts for rostered ministry, consider asking them if they have considered full-time ministry.

- Synod governance: Synod Council, boards, and committees and Conference Deans and Chairpersons.

The generosity of your Mission Support sustains all we do together in the synod and with our partners in outdoor ministries, campus ministries, colleges & universities, seminaries, across the ELCA, and around the world. Thank you!

Thank you for your witness as the church today. Thank you for your generosity and partnership. I give thanks for the signs of God's presence all around us and in our life together. *"You are God's field."* Thanks be to God!
