Grace

Meanings of "grace":

Something we say before a meal.

A pleasing or attractive quality. Elegance or beauty of manner, motion or action.

In the Lutheran church, we talk a lot about grace.

What is this "grace" we talk about in church? "Grace" is the free, unmerited, unearned love and forgiveness of God.

We can't earn God's grace, because we can't earn anything that is free. We don't deserve God's forgiveness.

grace through faith. Our good works won't earn our salvation.

I tell the confirmation students that if they don't remember

anything else from confirmation, to remember this: There is nothing we can do to make God love us more. There is nothing we can do to make God love us less. That's grace.

In October we celebrate Reformation Day and remember Martin Luther's contributions to the foundational for Luther's work. It church. Martin Luther was born in Germany in 1483. He entered the monastery to study for the

priesthood. He wore himself out

with prayer and fasting and wore out his superiors with his excessive and endless confessions.

But even these superhuman efforts did not bring peace to his We believe that we are saved by tormented soul. He wanted to earn God's love but was tormented by the sense that he could never be good enough.

Eventually it was these words from Romans that brought comfort to him. "For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law." (Romans 3:27-28)

This verse from Romans was reminds us that grace and justification come from God, not from our "work."

We are saved by grace, not by our works. There is nothing we can do to make God love us more or anything we can do to make God love us less.

None of our works will earn us acceptance with God and entrance into heaven.

That only comes as a free gift from God, apart from all of our religious dedication.

As we read in Ephesians, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life. (Ephesians 2:8-10)

How do we live in response to the grace God has shown us? We show the love of Christ to our neighbor.

As Martin Luther wrote, "The whole being of any Christian is faith and love. Faith brings the person to God, love brings the person to people." We don't earn God's love; we respond to it. *Thanks be to God!*


