Epiphany

"Our Source of Light"

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:

Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire







alone burns without destroying. The more perfect Father could there be! flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire sets it ablaze with love. What moved you to enlighten me with your truth? The fire of your love was the reason. You loved me so much that you could not bear to see me confused and perplexed. Can I

ever repay the burning love which you have given me? No, because I have nothing of my own to give. Yet you

assure me that the love which you put into my soul is repayment enough. You desire only the joy of seeing me receiving your gift. What

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Council Minutes December 20, 2023

Meeting was called to order by President Tom Moe at 7:45 p.m.

Members in attendance: Tom Moe, Brandon Ascheman, Bryan Schuerman, Cory Heinrich, Ray Trager, Rich Isder, Char Strand, Jon Hanson, Cindy Kanten, Andrea Westra, Pastor Kristine Isder

Devotions: None

Secretary Report: Minutes from September Council were reviewed.

Treasurers Report: None

Deacons Report: Char Strand- Regular worship has been held with communion being offered two Sundays each month. We discussed and encouraged promotion of the National Youth Gathering which will be held next summer. Pastor Kristine, Rich, and Char attended the Equipping Congregations event put on by the synod on December 2 at Vinje Lutheran Church in Willmar.

Trustees Report: Cory Heinrich-The chimes have been repaired and are being enjoyed by many again. They have met to work on the budget for 2024. A new shed has been brought in for storage and is all set up. They are still working on water mitigation in the church basement.

Board of Education Report: None

Pastor's Report: Pastor Kristine

- Attendance: from 34 to 115 (Christmas Program). Online worship is 100-200 per Sunday.
- Sunday School Christmas program was held December 17 during worship. It was a very good program.

- Christmas Eve: No worship service will be held the morning of Christmas Eve. Christmas Eve service will be at 6:30 at Kviteseid and 4:30 at Big Bend.
- Christmas Day: We will have a service at 9:00 with candle lighting.
- Sunday School: The kids made Christmas crafts to give to shut ins during December. They are also collecting items for the food shelf.
- Micronesians: They will be using our building after our service on Christmas Eve and again on Christmas Day.
- Projector: It quit working on October 1. A spare bulb has made it usable, but it is not as bright. Pastor is looking at options for the future.
- Confirmation Class: 10 students, 7 from Kviteseid, 3 from Big Bend
- Pastor meetings: zoom and in-person meetings
- Synod: Pastor, Rich, and Char attended Equipping Congregations Day in Willmar on December 2. Good information.
- Covid-19 precautions: We are still using hand sanitizer before communion and will continue to do so.
- Motion by Brandon Ascheman, second Bryan Schuerman to approve reports as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business: Cory Heinrich showed Myers Electric and Ottertail personnel around the building for the purpose of the emergency shelter and backup generator. They will be working on more specifics.

New Business: Motion by Char Strand to appoint Sherry Norby to the position of Council Secretary from now until the annual meeting on January 21. Second by Cindy Kanten. Approved. Motion by Ray Traeger to appoint Andrea Westra to the board of deacons from now until the annual meeting on January 21. Second by Jon Hanson. Approved.

Big Bend Lenten Services: Big Bend will host Fat Tuesday/Ash Wednesday on February 13 and also the service on Wednesday, February 21. The remaining Lenten services will be held at Kviteseid.

Big Bend Agreement: The original agreement said that they would meet once each year to discuss how the agreement is working. The members of the original group were to be included in the meeting. This will be looked into and followed up on to

schedule a meeting, perhaps following a Lenten service.



Annual Meeting: It will be held on January 21 at 9:00. President Tom Moe will be responsible for the rolls/ donuts.

Other: The trustees brought up that it would be helpful to have performance reviews available when working on the budget. At this point there is nothing in place. Clear job descriptions would be a starting place. This will take some time to develop.

Food Shelf: Talia Schuerman is looking into the possibility of starting a food pantry/shelf in the town of Milan. She met with the deacons and a good brainstorming session was held.

Next meeting: March 20, 2024 after Lenten service

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.

ELCA News

The Lutheran magazine, now Living Lutheran, printed its final issue in December 2023 and has moved fully online.

The Churchwide Organization will not stop telling stories of this church. Living Lutheran has transitioned to a full online storytelling engine featuring new ways of reaching people, providing a more economical and farreaching approach to engage with a broader audience.

The cost of printing a magazine including paper, ink and postage prices—has steadily increased, making it difficult to financially support a print edition. Being good stewards of the generous support given to the church is of the upmost importance to the staff.

The ELCA and its predecessor church bodies have been printing periodicals since 1831, when The Lutheran Observer first started. Spreading the gospel and sharing the stories of our church have always been at the foundation of who we are as Christians and Lutherans.

The sharing and spreading of the good news will continue with videos, audio stories, podcasts, and more with the potential for greater engagement with Lutherans and non-Lutherans alike. More online content will provide more options for telling the stories of the ELCA.
