Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder

The theme for our Wednesday night Lenten services was: What Does It Mean To Be ELCA Lutheran?

We began with the beginning of Christianity – the birth, death and resurrection of Jesus. The Christian church began when the Holy Spirit blew through the disciples on the Day of Pentecost as Jesus promised and sent them throughout the world to spread the good news.

After receiving the Holy Spirit, the disciples dispersed from Jerusalem and continued to spread the message of the risen Messiah. They shared the story of Jesus Christ and began to organize communities in his name. The movement grew.

Over the years there were many debates about church doctrine and teaching.

The first major split in the Christian church came in A.D. 1054, the "Great Schism" between the Eastern and Western faith traditions. The Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church have remained separate ever since.

The next split began in Europe in 1517 with the Protestant Reformation. Martin Luther was one of the protesters who tried to reform the Roman Catholic Church. They weren't successful. Many of them were kicked out of the church and ended up forming their own churches.

Throughout his ministry, Luther struggled with what it meant for someone to be "right with God." Luther came to the realization that nothing we can do can get us right with God and no amount of effort

on our part can get us to eternity.

God always comes down. We can't move closer to God no matter what we do.

We are saved by grace, not works.

As I tell the confirmation students each year, if you don't remember anything else from confirmation, remember this: There is nothing you can do to make God love you more and there is nothing you can do to make God love you less. That's grace.

As Lutherans, we believe in the theology of the cross rather than the theology of glory. Theology means thinking about God.

The theology of the **cross** emphasizes **God's work** – rather than human work. The theology of glory emphasizes human effort.

God's love in Jesus came down to us.

I like to think of God's example for us in Jesus Christ as one who got down and dirty for the sake of grace in the world – a theology of the cross; as opposed to being all high and mighty – a theology of glory.

The goal of our life as Christians is not to be good to earn our way into heaven. Jesus has already done that for us.

“The gospel is less about how to get into the Kingdom of Heaven **after** you die, and more about how to live in the Kingdom of Heaven **before** you die.” (Dallas Willard.)

Our goal is to bring heaven to earth, as we pray in the Lord's Prayer, “Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.”

How is it all going to end?

Some Christians believe it will end with the rapture, the belief in the return of Christ to rescue and deliver Christians off the earth.

The rapture is not biblical. There is no biblical support for such an event.

It will end with Jesus' second coming to **earth**. With a new heaven and a new earth.

God always comes down. So it will be at the end also. We don't know when it will be.

Just as with Jesus' first coming to earth, the second coming will be an event in which we can expect Jesus to confound all our

expectations – to our eternal joy and gratitude.

The second coming is the promise that the future of all creation is in God's hands, so we don't have to worry about it.

In Revelation John writes: “Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. And I saw the holy city coming down out of heaven from God. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away. See, I am making all things new.” (Revelation 21:1-5)

That gives us hope, because God always comes down to us.

March Joint Council Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Joint Council Minutes *March 19, 2025*

Members present: Brandon Ascheman, Cory Heinrich, Judi Bohm, Michelle Ascheman, Andy Streed, Jessica Trager, Ray Trager, Jon Hanson, Cindy Kanten and Pastor Kristine Isder.

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. by Judi Bohm, President.

Pastor Kristine led us in prayer.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes.

Treasurer's Report: Andy Streed reported fund balances: \$174,000 Gift/Memorials, \$21,000 in Checking and \$111,000 in the Building Fund.

Deacon's Report: Communion is going well. Cindy is trying to get an Easter Choir going for Easter Sunday. Sign up is in the narthex or speak with Cindy.

Trustee's Report: Cory Heinrich reported that they purchased the landscaping items at the end of the year before prices went up. They had reviewed the bid to repair four windows. They are moving forward with purchasing 15 tables for the fellowship hall. When they arrive, they will be pulling some of the older wooden tables for members to take for free will donation. They expect the tables to arrive within the next month. Theresa Erickson's position has still not been filled. Discussion on getting more of a description of the duties expected for each part of the position and where it will be posted. Hillary Spray/WIC were in contact about renting the Fellowship Hall for the WIC meetings every 2nd Wednesday of the month from 9:30-3:30pm. This was approved by the council. David Thompson has also been painting the hallway and ceiling upstairs to refresh. Lastly, the annual elevator inspection occurred in February and passed.

Board of Education: Michelle reported that VBS will be the first week in June. They will be serving 2 Lenten meals this

season. There will not be an Easter breakfast, but instead will be serving muffins, treats, juice in the Narthex. They will be doing an end of the year project as well and there are 2 Bible lessons left in the Sunday School rotation for the year. The older kids have been studying "Should we do as Jesus did?" Martin Luther, and going to Heaven. They have talked about a trip to the Hill Museum, Noah's Ark. Michelle sent out a message and is awaiting to hear from parents. They will also be doing a tasting of the Passover Meal and Last Supper.

Pastor's Report: Annual meeting went well. Attendance December-March 16 ranged from 26-75. Online attendance ranged 84-122. First communion for the year will be on Maundy Thursday with 4 fifth graders, 1 4th grader and 1 6th grader. Classes need to be set up. Confirmation class will not meet during Lent and only 9th grade will meet after Easter. Graduate recognition will be May 18, 4 graduates.

Lenten Services: Good turnout for Ash Wednesday -78 people. March 12 service was at Big Bend, 12 Kviteseid members attended. March 26 service will be in Big Bend as well. April 2, 9, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will be at Kviteseid.

The Lac Qui Parle Conference assembly was held February 23 at Kviteseid. Our conference consists of 28 churches and 2 nursing homes. Judi Bohm, Michelle Ascheman, Gavin Ascheman, Rich Isder, Bryan and Talia Schuerman, Nancy Streed and Pastor Kristine attended. They heard a report on Heritage Haven, a transitional housing project in Montevideo.

Pastor meetings continue to meet both by zoom and in person. Text study alternates one week in person, one week by zoom. Conference pastors meeting in person.

ELCA Online reports with membership and financial information was filed online by Theresa February 27. Both Pastor and Theresa worked on gathering data with it being important to get it submitted when going into the call process.

Big Bend turned 145 years old on March 17. They are celebrating on April 6 along with a sendoff for the parsonage which has been sold to be moved.

Lakeside worship- will check with Jeff and other churches. Pastor Linda Estling of Immanuel has agreed to lead the July and September services.

Micronesian students have not been coming to Sunday School after the first of the year. Hit or miss on attendance for confirmation. They have also not been using the church much lately.

Jingle offering for the kids is being received every Sunday. The kids will decide what the money will be used for.

Motion was made by Michelle Ascheman, seconded by Jon Hanson to approve reports. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- Call process: transition process. Cindy spoke with the Synod and Pastor Seyward Ask will be coming April 23 @ 7:00 p.m. to visit and go over the process.
- Constitution needs to be updated. Discussion over this took place.
- Meeting with Big Bend to go over the agreement with them will be on March 23 @ 2:00 p.m.

New Business:

- Pastor's parsonage allowance form was discussed and signed.
- Adopt A Highway was discussed with decision to renew.
- The nominating committee still needs three more members.
- Audit Committee- financial review to be done. Last was in 2018. 3 people needed. Bring to June meeting.
- Synod Assembly June 6-7. Jon Hanson volunteered to attend online. One other member needed; this will be in the newsletter/bulletin.
- Copies of the Final 2024 Annual Report prepared by Theresa were given out.

We closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

The next scheduled meeting will be June 18th at 7:30 p.m.

Meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m. by Judi Bohm, President.

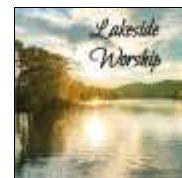
