





Kviteseid Lutheran Church Joint Council Minutes

September 17, 2025

Members present: Andy Streed, Ryan Erp, Ray Trager, Cory Heinrich, Cindy Kanten, Jon Hanson, Judi Bohm, Cheryl Erp, and Jessica Trager.

The meeting was called to order at 7:10pm by Judi Bohm, President and then led us in prayer.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes.

Treasurer's Report: Andy Streed reported fund balances: \$175,000 Gift/Memorials, \$73,000 in the Building Fund and \$6400 in checking.

Deacon's Report: Jon Hanson reported that he and Heidi Spray are gathering information for the profile of Kviteseid's ministry site. Confirmation will begin 9/24/25 being led by Jon and Heidi Spray. Information will be placed in the bulletin and mailer for those interested in volunteering to be on the call committee. All Saints Service will be on 11/2/2025. New members service date to be determined. Will continue to assemble welcome baskets and personally invite new members.

Trustee's Report: Cory Heinrich reported the approval of funds for the water diversion project. They are looking into a humidifier for in the sanctuary during the winter to keep moisture in the wood and the pews to prevent cracking. WIC will be done using Kviteseid in December. Cheryl will now be the point of contact for any Micronesian requests for use of space at Kviteseid. Mark Molden and Andy Streed checked the roof to verify

there are not leaks from above that could be contributing to the elevator shaft water leak. Landscaping is wrapping up. Thank you to Ryan Link and family for donating the grass seed and fabric for outside. We continue to be on the list with the contractor for the replacement of windows. Ryan Erp has been helping with IT and updating our computers, along with the livestream.

Board of Education: We have about 50 kids from 3-year-olds – 12th grade. A few new families and a lot of younger children attending. The first two weeks have gone well!



Dear Friends in Christ,

ing Members and hundreds of guests gathered for the 2025 **ELCA Churchwide Assembly** in Phoenix, under the theme "For the Life of the World." Central to our gathering were the words of Jesus: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven... the bread that I give for the life of the world is my flesh" (John 6:51).

First, we give thanks to our 18 Synod Voting Members who represented us with faith, dedication, and good spirit. They gave a week of their lives to pray, listen, learn, and participate in the life of the church. Their work reminds us that we serve a mission far larger than ourselves—for the life of the world.

Worship was a highlight of the Assembly, with inspiring sermons from Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, Rev. Imad Mousa Dawood Haddad, Bish- istries. The Assembly remindop Vashti Murphy McKenzie,

and Rev. Dr. Wyvetta Bullock. You can listen to these messages and read summaries of the Assembly on Living Lutheran - 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Significant decisions were made:

Bishop Yehiel Currey was This summer, over 800 Vot- elected Presiding Bishop, and Rev. CeCee Mills was elected Secretary.

> We welcomed new members to the Church Council and various committees, including the affirmation of youth and young adult participation at 20%.

Memorials and social statements were adopted, including Faith and Civic Life: For the Well-being of All and updates on human sexuality and Palestinian rights.

The Assembly recognized the importance of prayer, reflection, and learning, including awareness for missing and murdered Indigenous women, and a candlelight vigil for refugees and immigrants.

As we move forward, let us continue to pray for these leaders and support their mined us that the church is always

growing, learning, and responding to God's call. As Martin Luther reminds us: "We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it; the process is not yet finished, but it is going on."

May we embrace the world God is bringing to life in Christ, and live out the mission of the church for the life of the world to come—here and now.
