INTRODUCTION

What does it mean to receive the kingdom of God as a child does?

CALL TO WORSHIP

P Long ago, at different times and in various ways,
God spoke to our ancestors through the Hebrew prophets.
But in these last days,
we have heard God's voice through His Son, Jesus Christ,
who has been given dominion over all things
and through whom all worlds were made.

C **He is the One who sustains the universe by the power of his command;
the One who gave himself to free us from the grip of sin and death;
the One who, even now, reigns in the heavens,
seated at the right hand of God. This is our God!
Let us worship together.**

**CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P We have an advocate on high: Jesus Christ, *Heb. 1:3-4, 9*
who stooped down to save us from our sin
but rose in honor and glory to reign forever.
Therefore let us seek God's grace.

C **Loving God, you created us *Gen. 2:18-24;*
to live in relationship with you, *Mark 10:2-12*
to love and serve one another,
and to care for all your creatures.
Yet, in the hardness of our hearts,
we dismiss your commandments
and seek to go our separate ways.
Lord, have mercy on us.
Redeem, restore, and re-create us,
for the sake of Christ our Savior. Amen.**

P What are we that God is mindful of us? *Ps. 8:4; Heb. 2:6,*
Who are we that God should care for us? *10-12*
Yet God now calls us beloved children;

Jesus now claims us as sisters and brothers.
This is the good news of God's grace:
In Jesus Christ we are forgiven.

LESSON: Genesis 2:18-24

Genesis 2 stresses that people are not meant to live in isolation but in relationship. Out of love for humanity, God creates them male and female, to provide companionship for each other and to become with each other "one flesh." The Hebrew words used here are ish (man) and ishshah (woman).

L ¹O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!—

C ²**you whose glory is chanted above the heavens out of the mouths of infants and children; you have set up a fortress against your enemies, to silence the foe and avenger.**

L ³When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers,
the moon and the stars you have set in their courses,

C ⁴**what are mere mortals that you should be mindful of them,
human beings that you should care for them?**

L ⁵Yet you have made them little less than divine;
with glory and honor you crown them.

C ⁶**You have made them rule over the works of your hands;
you have put all things under their feet:**

L ⁷all flocks and cattle, even the wild beasts of the field,

C ⁸**the birds of the air, the fish of the sea,
and whatever passes along the paths of the sea.**

L ⁹O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

Quoting from the psalms, this passage from Hebrews emphasizes that Jesus, the one through whom God created everything and who sits at God's right hand, is also the one who experienced human suffering and death in order to blaze the path of salvation for us.
