INTRODUCTION

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God’s mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ’s love with the world.

OPENING PRAYER

C God of wind and fire, embolden us this day to receive your power. Help us to proclaim the wondrous things that you have done and continue to do in our lives. Give us strength and courage to share the Good News of your love and your presence. For we ask this in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

**CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

P Let us call on the name of the One who invites us to speak the truth about ourselves and our relationships and promises to show us mercy.

**C Holy and Merciful God,
we do not know how to pray as we ought, *Rom. 8:26*
and we know too well our constant failures
to do as you have commanded and to hold fast to your word.
Forgive us for the divisions we nurture, guide us to your way,
keep us in your care, and lead us into faith.
We trust your word that the Spirit of truth
will show us all things and grant us courage and peace. Amen.**

**P People of God, body of Christ, sisters and brothers,
the Spirit of God’s truth has come upon creation and upon you.
Through the power of the Holy Spirit,
in the name of Christ Jesus, our Savior,

PENTECOST LITANY

HYMN “Spirit of Gentleness” (v. R) ELW #396

P From the very instant of creation, your Holy Spirit moved on the waters of creation, bringing to life the creative love that is God.

HYMN “Spirit of Gentleness” (vs. 1, R) ELW #396

L Even when the people were forgetful and stubborn, your Holy Spirit called to them to be unafraid, to follow. It led them through the desert to a land of sweet dwelling.

P During all the times of fear and tumult, you sang the song of hope through the prophets, who called people back to you with tender forgiveness.

HYMN “Spirit of Gentleness” (vs. 2, R) ELW #396

L On a dark winter night you sang your sweetest song and birthed a Savior who came to bring us life and witness to your love and power.

HYMN “Spirit of Gentleness” (vs. 3, R) ELW #396

P At the lakeshore you called to the simple people, the fishermen, to come and follow you. They witnessed your miracles of healing and forgiving love.

L When the night seemed to be the darkest, even though it was mid-day—you gave your Son to be a witness to your love. From His cross He forgave those who crucified Him and reminded a thief that paradise would be his home.

P On the early morning, the women were startled with the news of His resurrection. Could it be that all He had said was true?

L The disciples hid in fear of what others might say, think or do. They were astonished at his presence to them.

P Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness, help us to dream dreams and see visions of all that is possible for the healing and hope for this world.

L Help us cross lines which divide and unite to proclaim boldly that you are the Spirit of Absolute Love and Peace. Emblazon our spirits. Make bold our voices. Give joy to our hearts, for we have been called to be witnesses, even to the ends of the world. Amen.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

P Let us pray.

C **Mighty God, you breathe life into our bones, and your Spirit brings truth to the world. Send us this Spirit, transform us by your truth, and give us language to proclaim your gospel, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.**

LESSON: Acts 2:1-21

Originally Pentecost was a Jewish thanksgiving-type festival celebrated seven weeks after Passover. On this particular Pentecost, however, the Holy Spirit is poured out upon the entire community of believers just as Jesus had promised and the scriptures had prophesied. Empowered by the Spirit, the entire community bears witness to God's activity in multiple languages.

PSALM 104:24-34, 35b

- L ²⁴How manifold are your works, O LORD!
In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.
- C ²⁵**Yonder is the sea, great and wide, with its swarms too many to number,
living things both small and great.**
- L ²⁶There go the ships to and fro,
and Leviathan, which you made for the sport of it.
- C ²⁷**All of them look to you to give them their food in due season.**
- L ²⁸You give it to them; they gather it;
you open your hand, and they are filled with good things.
- C ²⁹**When you hide your face, they are terrified;
when you take away their breath, they die and return to their dust.**
- L ³⁰You send forth your Spirit, and they are created;
and so you renew the face of the earth.
- C ³¹**May the glory of the LORD endure forever;
O LORD, rejoice in all your works.**
- L ³²You look at the earth and it trembles; you touch the mountains and they smoke.
- C ³³**I will sing to the LORD as long as I live;
I will praise my God while I have my being.**
- L ³⁴May these words of mine please God. I will rejoice in the LORD.
- C ^{35b}**Bless the LORD, O my soul. Hallelujah!**

LESSON: Romans 8:22-27

By pouring the Holy Spirit into our hearts, God gives us the promised first fruit of eternal life so that we await God's future in hope. In the meantime, the Spirit also intercedes for us by carrying the prayers of our weak human hearts to God.
