


Introduction for the Day

In today's gospel the Samaritan woman asks Jesus for water, an image of our thirst for God. Jesus offers living water, a sign of God's grace flowing from the waters of baptism. The early church used this gospel and those of the next two Sundays to deepen baptismal reflection during the final days of preparation before baptism at Easter. As we journey to the resurrection feast, Christ comes among us in word, bath, and meal—offering us the life-giving water of God's mercy and forgiveness.

We commit ourselves to things that will never last.

We worship things that will never bring salvation.

Still, you offer us the gift of living water.

Still, you offer us the gift of eternal life.

Forgive us, O Lord, and give us this living water, so that we may never thirst again. Amen.

P This is the good news of God's grace:

Rom. 5:8-10

Though we were sinners, Christ died for us.

Though we were enemies of God, God loved us.

Once we were lost and dead—now Christ has become our life and salvation. In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven.

LESSON: Exodus 17:1-7

Because the thirsty Israelites quarreled with Moses and put God to the test, Moses cried out in desperation to God. God commanded Moses to strike the rock to provide water for the people. The doubt-filled question—"Is the Lord among us or not?"—received a very positive answer.

PSALM 95

- L Come, let us sing to the LORD; let us shout for joy to the rock of our salvation.
- C ²Let us come before God's presence with thanksgiving and raise a loud shout to the LORD with psalms.
- L ³For you, LORD, are a great God, and a great ruler above all gods.
- C 4In your hand are the caverns of the earth; the heights of the hills are also yours.
- L 5The sea is yours, for you made it, and your hands have molded the dry land.
- C ⁶Come, let us worship and bow down, let us kneel before the LORD our maker.

LESSON: Romans 5:1-11

Though we often hear that God helps those who help themselves, here Paul tells us that through Jesus' death God helps utterly helpless sinners. Since we who had been enemies are reconciled to God in the cross, we now live in hope for our final salvation.
