

INTRODUCTION

A house divided against itself cannot stand. Jesus makes this observation in light of charges that he is possessed. He is possessed, not by a demon, but by the Holy Spirit. We who have received the Holy Spirit through baptism have been joined to Christ's death and resurrection and knit together in the body of Christ. Those with whom we sing and pray this day are Jesus' family. With them we go forth in peace to do the will of God.

**CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

But with God, there is forgiveness.
May God hear our request for mercy.

C **Merciful God,**
we try to hide from your presence, *Gen. 3:8-10*
knowing that we have traded your abundant life for a wasteland of sin.
We have not followed your will, but instead heed other voices
and pursue our own desires at the expense of others.
We are so misguided that we cannot discern good from evil,
making the wrong choice, choosing the wrong side.
We ask for the courage to tell you truthfully what we have done.
We pray for forgiveness so that we can live with ourselves,
with others, and with you.
You alone can restore us. *Ps. 130:7-8*
In steadfast love, look upon us and reclothe us in your grace;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

P Brothers and sisters, do not lose heart. *2 Cor. 4:15-16*
We are being renewed day by day
through the grace of Christ extended to us. Amen.

LESSON: Genesis 3:8-15

Immediately after Adam and Eve eat the forbidden fruit, they hide from God. Neither takes responsibility for their sin, instead blaming each other, the snake, and even God. The curse on the snake was understood as a messianic prophecy by the early church, who associated Eve's "offspring" with Christ.

PSALM 130

L **¹Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD;**

C **²O LORD, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication.**

L **³If you were to keep watch over sins, O LORD, who could stand?**

C **⁴Yet with you is forgiveness, in order that you may be feared.**

L **⁵I wait for you, O LORD; my soul waits; in your word is my hope.**

C **⁶My soul waits for the Lord more than those who keep watch for the morning, more than those who keep watch for the morning.**

L **⁷O Israel, wait for the LORD, for with the LORD there is steadfast love; with the LORD there is plenteous redemption.**

C **⁸For the LORD shall redeem Israel from all their sins.**

LESSON: 2 Corinthians 4:13 - 5:1

Life in the present is transitory and cannot compare with the eternal home God has prepared for us. So we do not despair no matter what life might bring because we know that as God raised Jesus from the dead, God promises to bring us into eternal life.
