Bishop Jon's Goodbye: To God Be the Glory

It has been something, being called to serve as a bishop in this synod for the past eighteen years.

As I remember and process this moment in our life and mine, I am struck by the persistence of gratitude.

To serve as a bishop here has been something stunning, amazing, challenging, funny, full of losses, sad, hard, rewarding, full of joys, full of broken gifted people and a reminder of God's amazing presence and grace day after day after day. It has been a great honor and privilege.

Thanks for being on the road with me as we sought to follow Jesus. Thanks to all the folks who have and currently serve as synod staff. Thanks to all the people who have and are serving on boards, committees, task forces and the

synod council. Thanks to all the colleagues in synod and churchwide offices who coached, challenged, and encouraged me.

Now it is time to hand off this responsibility to a new bishop. I am confident that Bishop Dee Pederson, the remaining staff, and the new staff who will be called to this synod into the next, and I trust, even better chapter of its life. She has deeper history in this synod than I do. I trust God was in the process that called her. I trust that God's Spirit will walk with her into this next chapter and all of you.

In my daily Bible reading, reflection and prayer it was powerful on my last Monday as bishop when this lesson showed up in the 12th Chapter of Romans. I will use Eugene Peterson's paraphrase to help you hear it

afresh.

12: 1-2) So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you.

3) I'm speaking to you out of deep gratitude for all that God has given me, and especially as I have responsibilities in relation to you. Living then, as every one of you does, in pure grace, it's important that you not misinterpret yourselves as people who are bringing this goodness to God. No, God brings it all to you. The only accurate way to understand ourselves is by what God is and by what he does for us, not by what we are and what we do for him.

4-6) In this way we are like the various parts of a human body. Each part gets its meaning from the body as a whole, not the other way

around. The body we're talking about is Christ's body of chosen people. Each of us finds our meaning and function as a part of his body. But as a chopped-off finger or cut-off toe we wouldn't amount to much, would we? So since we find ourselves fashioned into all these excellently formed and marvelously functioning parts in Christ's body, let's just go ahead and be what we were made to be, without enviously or pridefully comparing ourselves with each other, or trying to be something we aren't.

6-8) If you preach, just preach God's Message, nothing else; if you help, just help, don't take over; if you teach, stick to your teaching; if you give encouraging guidance, be careful that you don't get bossy; if you're put in charge, don't manipulate; if you're called to give aid to people in distress, keep your

eyes open and be quick to respond; if you work with the disadvantaged, don't let yourself get irritated with them or depressed by them. Keep a smile on your face.



Church Council Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Council Minutes September 15, 2021

Members Present: Ken Lee, Sherry Norby, Rob Schwendemann, Josh Moen, Nate Spray, Josh Vetter, Marie Molden, Reed Molden, Cindy Kanten, Rich Isder, Char Strand and Pastor Kristine Isder.

The meeting was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by Vice President Ken Lee. Pastor Kristine led the group in devotions and prayer.

Motion was made by Reed Molden, seconded by Josh Moen, to accept the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes. Motion was made by Rich Isder, seconded by Josh Vetter, to approve the Secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: The church is doing good financially. Rob Schwendemann has gone over the monthly reports, check ledgers, etc. and everything balanced out. Motion was made by Josh Moen, seconded by Reed Molden, to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Deacons' Report: Marie Molden reported that Communion has been going well at the altar. Those serving communion will wear masks. They will continue to tape every other pew so people will sit further apart. Motion was made by Josh Vetter, seconded by Nate Spray, to approve the Deacons' report. Motion carried.

Trustees' Report: Josh Vetter stated that the rock on the east side of the church will be taken out and replaced with new river rock. Part of it has been done by the Tostenson family as a memorial to Arlo. The sump pump issue in the elevator was fixed, but now there appears to be some leaking. Motion was made by Reed Molden, seconded by Cindy Kanten, to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Board of Education Report: No report. Pastor said that Rally Sunday went well. The students released balloons and one was found that evening by Jordan MN (138 miles away)! There are t-shirts for sale in the Narthex as a fundraiser for the Sunday School/youth program.

Pastor's Report: Worship attendance has increased and there are still 100-200 online worshippers per week.

There were 81 people that attended the lakeside worship on Sept. 5th and \$260 was collected for the FLY backpack program which provides food/snacks for eligible students on weekends.

God's Work, Our Hands Sunday on Sept. 12 was well attended with 71 people helping.

Kviteseid hosted a FedTel Streaming meeting in August. FedTel wired internet to the church basement for the meeting and the equipment will stay. A member paid for the equipment and FedTel covered the rest.

Bishop Dee Pederson assumed her duties on Sept. 1st.

Next year's National Youth Gathering is in Minneapolis.

Old Business: The Luther League treasurer position will again be tabled until the next meeting.

New Business: Motion by Nate Spray, seconded by Rob Schwendemann, to continue sponsoring the new missionaries, Dr. Steven and Dr. Jodi Swanson, same as the previous missionary. Motion carried.

Covid precautions will continue and Pastor will check with other pastors as to what they are doing in their churches.

The idea has been raised about having a church supper again. The first thing would be to find people to chair the event. We will again ask for donations in place of the supper.

The date for the Annual Meeting was set for Sunday, January 9, at 9:00 a.m.

Motion was made by Reed Molden, seconded by Josh Moen, to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 p.m. Motion carried.

Pastor Kristine led the group in the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be December 15, 2021, at 7:45 p.m.

Installation of New Bishop

The Rev. Dr. Dee Pederson became Acting Bishop of the Southwestern Minnesota Synod on September 1.

She will be installed Saturday, October 9 at 2:00 p.m. at Granite Falls Lutheran Church. The Rev. Elizabeth Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, will be present to preside and install the new bishop. Pastors are invited to vest and take part in the procession.

For those not able to attend in person, livestream will be available on the synod's website and Facebook.

Those attending in person are required to wear masks indoors and will be asked to maintain physical distancing. In lieu of a formal reception, the synod will be providing individually wrapped treats to go. Inside and outdoor space will be available for socializing. All are welcome.

Fall Theological Conference

In order to ensure the greatest safety and comfort for all participants, the synod decided to move the Fall Theological Conference for pastors online using Zoom. It will be held October 11 and 12. The topic of the conference will be "*Leadership in a Time When Everything Has and Hasn't Changed.*"

Staff Changes

Pastor Kathryn Skoglund has retired as a synod minister. The position of Director of Evangelical Mission (DEM) is also open due to

the election of Rev. Dee Pederson as bishop. Sister Sarah Hausken, Synod Youth Ministry Coordinator, will be leaving the synod staff as she has accepted a position as the Director of Vocation and Education for the Deaconess Community of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada.

Searches are underway to fill these positions.
