PRELUDE

WELCOME & ANNOUNCEMENTS

Please read the words to the hymns silently.

Please read aloud the **bold texts**.

Please read the *italicized texts* silently in your heart as your own words.

CALL TO WORSHIP

P O God, our mouths are often full of lies and deceit; our lips drip the poison of asps that would strike and destroy the happiness of others.
