Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder

Earth Day was April 22. Earth Day was first organized in 1970 to promote ecology and respect for life on the planet as well as to encourage awareness of the growing problems of air, water and soil pollution. Since then, billions of people from more than 190 countries have come together every April to raise awareness of stewardship of creation.

Some of you may remember Rogation Days, which were traditionally celebrated on the days before Ascension Day. The word Rogation has its roots in the Latin word that means to ask or petition. In some places the celebrations of Rogation Days included processions from the church to and around fields while asking for God's blessing.

Stewardship of creation is an

ongoing ministry in the church. The creation that God declared good is entrusted to the care of humankind. Exercising that care is one dimension of daily Christian discipleship.

Human beings are to be loving caretakers of all God called good.

"God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day." (Genesis 1:31)

"The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." (Genesis 2:15)

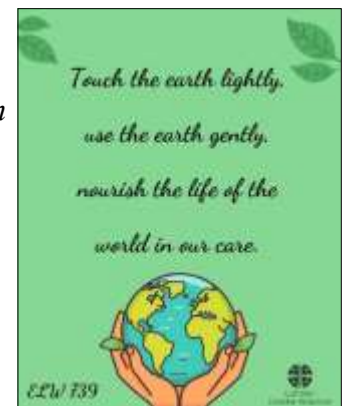
Humans, in service to God, have special roles on behalf of the whole of creation. Made in the image of God, we are called to care for the earth as God cares for the earth.

What specifically can we do? We can make sure we don't litter, we can conserve water, and we can recycle. Many items can be recycled – paper, cans, bottles. All items that are recycled reduce the amount of trash that is buried in landfills. Hazardous household waste should be disposed of properly to avoid contaminating the ground water. Electronics can be recycled to reuse some of the materials in them. Watch the newspapers for recycling dates.

them, and that generations yet to come may continue to praise you for your bounty; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (ELW p. 80)

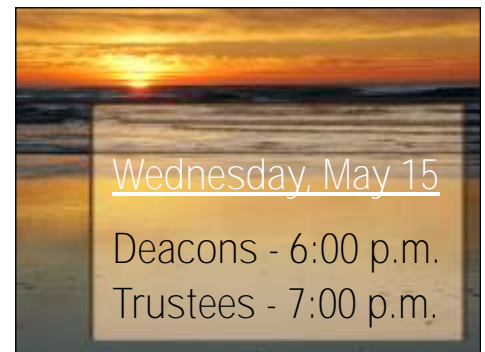

March Joint Council Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Joint Council Minutes March 20, 2024

Members Present: Tom Moe, Rob Schwendemann, Sherry Norby, Andy Streed, Brandon Ascheman, Cory Heinrich, Ray Trager, Jon Hanson, Cindy Kanten, Heidi Spray and Pastor Kristine Isder.

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. by President Tom Moe.

Pastor Kristine gave devotions and a prayer.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes.

Treasurer's Report: There was no treasurer's report.

Deacon's Report: Jon Hanson reported that there are five new lecturers (Gavin Ascheman, Charlie Hanson, Isaac Hanson, Gabby Augeson and Nancy Streed).

Trustee's Report:

- Work is being done on the Sunday School wing. Mark Molden and Andy Streed will be working on the soffit and fascia.
- Quotes are being requested for fixing the retaining wall on the northeast corner and to fix the steps on the southeast corner. They should have numbers by our next meeting.
- Big Bend agreed to increase their match by three percent for their agreement with Kviteseid for pastoral services. In the future, they will increase their portion the same percentage as we in-

crease the pastor's salary.

- The City has given up on the idea of using the church as an emergency shelter.
- Received bids from Advanced Ministry Technologies to replace the projector.

Board of Education: Pastor Kristine

- There will be a Youth Lock-In on April 14-15 and Waffles and Family Night on April 24th.

Pastor's Report:

- Attendance in person ranged from 23-75 and online reached from 82-224.
- There are four youth receiving their first communion. Three will receive it on Maundy Thursday and one on April 7th (out of state on Maundy Thursday).
- Three students will be confirmed on April 28th.
- Two graduates will be recognized on May 19th.
- Combined Lenten services with Big Bend were well attended by both congregations.
- The Lac qui Parle Conference Assembly was held February 18th and Kviteseid had the most people attend than any other congregation.
- The Synod Assembly is June 7-8. Pastor Kristine will be recognized for the 10th anniversary of her ordination.
- There will be a Luther League checkbook kept in the church office with three signers on the account.

Motion was made by Jon Hanson to approve all reports, seconded by Brandon Ascheman. Motion carried.

Old Business: No discussion.

New Business:

- The Pastor's Housing Allowance was approved. This does not increase her salary, but allows her to exclude from gross income the cost of furnishings, maintenance, repairs and utilities.
- It was decided to keep the "Adopt A Highway" program.
- Since no one volunteered at the annual meeting to attend the Synod Assembly in June, Pastor asked if anyone would volunteer. Cory Heinrich was going to check if it would work for either he or his wife and Jon Hanson said he would do the zoom meeting, if needed.

We closed the meeting by praying the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be June 19, at 7:45 p.m.

Excerpts from Bishop Dee Pederson's 2024 Synod Assembly Theme Series – Part 1

The theme of the 2024 Synod Assembly is “One Body in Christ”.

The past few years have taken a toll on relationships everywhere.

Some have said we’ve forgotten how to talk with each other. Many of us miss being with people we used to be connected to. All of us note how in some way, relationships are just hard these days. And this is no less a reality in the church.

Of course, we’re not the first Jesus followers to experience disconnect, debate, or division. Relationships were a challenge for the earliest followers, too. St. Paul reminded the Christians in Rome that God’s very self was given for them in a way they would never expect: in the death of the crucified Christ upon a cross. He wrote, *“Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.”* – Romans 6:3-4.

Those who are baptized into Christ are ushered into new life in community. And when we gather at the Holy Meal, Jesus gathers us together with all the other precious children of God.

“So we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another.” – Romans 12:5.

This means that followers of Jesus, and participants in our own faith communities, are freed from those expressions of being bound in our sin - holding grudges, speaking ill of another, judging others, ignoring our neighbors, hoarding salvation as my personal possession. We have been made members of one body. There is a unity amid our diversity, and that unity is forever and only in Christ.

Oneness in the church. It seems like it should be easy, right? After all, it is what Jesus prayed for us, *“I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also maybe in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.”* – John 17:20-21.

Jesus is not saying here that everyone ought to agree with one another, nor that that is even possible. He is not saying that unity means uniformity. He is pointing to a oneness known in the Holy Trinity – something far bigger than whether or not we “agree” with each other on issues of the day.

How does that oneness come to us? It begins in Holy Baptism as we are joined to the communion, the persons, of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Not only this, but in Holy Baptism, the triune God also brings us into community with the whole people of God, as our liturgy states: *“We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God’s mission for the life of the world.”* (ELW, p. 227).

The earliest Christians could not imagine themselves in isolation from others. They were part of a household of faith, in relationship

with others in a particular place. It was impossible for a Christian to be the church alone. But this sounds very different from the individualism of our culture and messages we hear today.

The oneness of the church as “communion” or “community” is present in the Lutheran Confessions. We believe God’s good and gracious work is done through the spoken word and the sacraments, the power of forgiveness, and also through the mutual conversation and consolation of others in the church. (The Smalcald Articles).

To be the church involves being in relationship with others because Christ has made it so.

But what is the purpose of this oneness? Why did Jesus pray for it? In his prayer, the purpose for our oneness is so that the world might believe. Over the centuries, and certainly today, we Christians are known by some for our divisions. We can be pretty good at cutting ourselves off from each other for a whole variety of reasons. The prayer of Jesus reminds us how the world will only believe a witness that comes from the life of the beloved community together. One.

“O God, form the minds of your faithful people into one will. Make us love what you command and desire what you promise, that, amid all the changes of this world, our hearts may be fixed where true joy is found, your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.” (ELW, p. 35)
