Be Kind

Love

In January I wrote about being kind. I suggested a motto for 2024: "spread kindness and show kindness to others." Or simply, "Be Kind."

Kindness flows out of love. We celebrate Valentine's Day on February 14, which also happens to be Ash Wednesday this year.

Valentine's Day is all about love, usually romantic love. But we can celebrate all kinds of love, especially the love that God has for us. The source of all love is God. who created us all.

"God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another." (1 John 4:9-11)

"We love because God first loved us." (1 John 4:19)

"Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another." (1 John 4:11)

"Let all that you do be done in love." (1 Corinthians 16:14)

The word for love used in these verses in Greek is "agape". Greek is the original language of the New Testament. Greek has several words God with all your heart, and with for love, but agape is the type of love the Bible speaks about the most.

Agape love does not mean romantic love, liking or even friendship. Agape love is concerned with the greatest good of another.

Agape love shows a positive regard towards the other, always wanting the best for them. This kind of love is one-sided, because it expects nothing in return.

Love is a verb – something you do. It is what you choose to say, and how you choose to act, or react.

The most important thing we are called to do is to love God and to love neighbor.

That's what Jesus taught during His ministry 2,000 some years ago: love God and love others.



and eat and stay and worship!



In this service, we recognize that we build our lives on very shaky foundations, and then we are surprised when things start collapsing. Jesus reminds us in his teachings that the only solid foundation is himself, the Rock of our salvation. On him alone we build.



CROSS OF ASHES — On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return."

2023 Annual Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church 2023 Annual Meeting Minutes January 21, 2024

The Annual Meeting of Kviteseid Lutheran Church was held on January 21, 2024.

President Tom Moe called the meeting to order at 9:09 a.m.

Motion was made by Judi Bohm, seconded by Teresa Olson, to adopt the agenda, as presented. Motion carried.

Pastor Kristine gave devotions.

Motion was made by Jon Hanson, seconded by Bryan Schuerman, to approve the minutes of the 2023 Annual Meeting. Motion carried.

The following reports were given:

Pastor's Report – The church currently has 355 baptized and 286 confirmed members. Joint Lenten services with Big Bend were held again this year. The agreement with Big Bend is working well. Two vouth took classes and received their first communion and four young people affirmed their baptism on Confirmation Sunday. Three graduating seniors were recognized on May 21 and received quilts. Vacation Bible School was held for two nights in August. A new AED (automated external defibrillator) was installed at church. New speakers for the chimes were installed in December with the help of Ottertail Power Company employees and boom truck. Three joint lakeside services were held during the summer holiday weekends. God's Work Our Hands Sunday was held on September 10 with several service projects being completed. The video services reach 100-200 people each Sunday.

Treasurer's Report – The Treasurer's Report will be included in the final annual report. Expenses were under budget for the year. We ended the year with \$26,147 in the checking account after transferring \$12,000 to the building fund.

Trustees' Report – The following items were fixed/installed: leaky AC unit in the balcony was fixed, replaced the utility shed, installed the baseboard behind the altar, replaced all four chime speakers, and consulted with a contractor on ideas for water mitigation within the elevator shaft. The City of Milan has approached the board on the idea of the Church becoming an emergency shelter for the community, funded by grants. Many more meetings and discussion to come on this proposal.

Board of Education – There are 36 students in pre-k through 9th grade. They do a rotation of Art, Bible Skills and Games, Cooking and Theater. Each week, they work on memory work and music. The students are focusing on giving back to others and have done several projects which are given to others or used in a silent auction. The Christmas program was great, even after only two practices. They also hosted a food drive.

Deacons' Report – Communion was offered twice a month, except June, July and August when it was offered once per month. It was also available at the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services. The deacons filled in for Pastor Kristine when she was gone and arranged for pulpit supply. There are currently three couples, one family and six

individuals who are part of Kviteseid Connectors. They have connected with 17 members on a regular basis, who are unable to attend regular worship at Kviteseid.

Helping Hands Board – There were approximately 70 quilts made and distributed. The profits from Syttende Mai were around \$3,500. They made several monetary donations and served Lenten suppers. The Military committee filled and mailed several boxes to our military personnel. More than 400 rolled bandages and 40 layettes were delivered to Global Missions. Thanks to Thrivent for their grants that helped with several of these projects. The Service Groups decorated the church for fall and Christmas seasons, prepared and delivered Easter Cheer Baskets and served three funeral lunches. The Service Groups will no longer be responsible for yearly cleaning of specific areas of the church. Those using the Fellowship Hall are strongly encouraged to wipe tables, check chairs and clean up the kitchen as they are used.

Endowment Board – As of 12/31/23, the endowment fund has a balance of \$397,665.73. They distributed \$12,000 to several groups. Since inception in the early 2000s, the endowment fund has earned \$113,759.27 and distributed \$87,100.05 to many organizations, ministries, Bible camps, food shelves, missions and people in need.

Motion was made by Keith Kvistero, seconded by Brian Olson, to approve all the reports. Motion carried.

There was no old business.

Excerpts from Bishop Dee Pederson's 2023 Annual Report – Part 1

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ......

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

- 1 Cor. 12.

One of the great joys of my call is to visit the congregations across this synod. We are very different from each other; yet in Jesus Christ, we all are one.

This year as a synod, we have been united by focusing on the WORD: Jesus—the Word—made flesh, and the word of Scripture—as the source and center of our lives.

Those actions – *Embody*, *Serving*, *and Living the Word Today* – provide the framework for reviewing this year.

Embody the Word

Thank you for the way you, as beloved children of God, embody the word in your congregations and daily callings. Post pandemic, congregations have a clearer sense of who we are and what God is calling us to be and do today.

As we review the past year, one place to turn is the numbers. It's not all about the numbers, but trends do tell a story. These numbers represent real people, hearing the story of God's love in Jesus Christ.

The most recent statistical summary for congregations comes from the annual reports completed for 2022. Of the 229 congregations in

the SW MN Synod in 2022, 166 filed an annual report.

What stories do those figures tell? There is the cultural trend of fewer people connecting with a faith community. But these numbers also represent stories of outreach as adults are welcomed through Holy Baptism as hospitality is extended and new members are received, and as people are drawn to worshiping together both in the room and online.

We know there is great generosity in our congregations! Although earned income for congregations was challenged last year everywhere, regular giving and other receipts increased.

Thank you for the generous Mission Support you shared with the synod in 2022. We have seen a significant decrease in Mission Support in 2023. Why? We know that the cushion of PPP money is used up. Everything costs more. Some of our congregations' most generous givers are passing away or face high costs for elder care. And there is the tendency that when faced with financial challenges, congregations choose to direct funds close to home. Whatever the reason, we will continue to wisely steward the resources we receive and are committed to prioritizing providing pastoral care of congregations and rostered ministers. Like you, we know that challenges can also lead to doing things in new ways, and we trust in God's creative Spirit as we plan for the future. Thank you for your generosity.
