



**Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder**

Our first lesson for August 22 from Joshua included this well-known verse: **“Choose this day whom you will serve . . . but as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord.”** (Joshua 24:15)

It’s a popular verse and appears on many home décor items.

The background of this text is that the people of Israel are about to finally enter the Promised Land after 40 years of wilderness wanderings. Moses has passed the mantle of leadership to Joshua. But before they depart, Joshua calls the leaders together to hear the word of the Lord. They are challenged to follow the God who has done so much with and for them.

The Israelites respond, **“Therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God”** (Joshua 24:18).

The people recommit themselves to God. They are now ready to live on God’s land in the way God wants.

Why did the Israelites choose to follow God? Because of what God has done for them.

We are fairly good at reminding ourselves how we have been blessed. We are fairly good at reminding ourselves to say thank you. But as people of faith, our story and tradition pushes us to take the next step.

Joshua challenges the people to not only remember and be thankful, but to serve.

Notice that the verse doesn’t talk about belief. It talks about service. **“Choose this day whom you will SERVE.”** See what God has done for you? Now how will you respond?

It’s not just believing, it’s doing. It’s about a willingness to order one’s life according to God’s law. We live our lives according to the commitments we have made.

Whose disciple will you show yourself to be? Will the way you live your life reflect the choice you have made about whom you will serve?

Will you live for yourself or live to help and serve others?

What does it mean to say, as Joshua does, **“but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord”**? How do we live that out? It is shown in how we use the blessings and gifts we have been given. What we do with our time, our talent, and our treasure shows who we serve.

Do our actions show that we understand ourselves to be living in

#### Installation of New Bishop

SW, MN Synod Bishop-Elect

The Rev. Dr. Dee Pederson becomes Acting Bishop of the Southwestern Minnesota Synod on September 1.

Service of Holy Communion with the Installation of The Rev. Dr. Dee Pederson as Bishop of the SWMN Synod, ELCA will be Saturday, October 9 at 2:00 pm with a reception to follow at Granite Falls Lutheran Church. The Rev. Elizabeth Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, will be present to preside and install the new bishop.

The synod will continue to monitor the state's safe gathering guidelines and will post protocol updates on the synod website as needed. Livestream will be hosted on the synod's website for those not able to attend in person.

The service will celebrate God's mission shared by the congregations and all the baptized of the SWMN Synod of the ELCA:

God places us in cities, farms and towns together under one prairie sky.

The Risen Christ surprises us with opportunities to plant God's Word in the world.

Walking together in confidence, we cultivate life-giving congregations, nurture partner ministries, and cooperate in the life of the ELCA.

By God's grace, together we have what we need.

### Rev. Alex LaChapelle — our former ELCA missionary —

Greetings in Christ!

As of July 15<sup>th</sup>, I will no longer serve as an ELCA missionary. I write these words sitting in my apartment in Kenya, quite dusty from my last visit over a year ago. It is set up looking like a place left in a hurry. I saw this before when I served in New Orleans, about two years after the storm. We would still find houses untouched, apartments left as if they were coming back tomorrow. You can tell I did the last bit of dishes; I hung some rags to dry, picked up a little and left long ago March 2020. I believed it would only be a few months at most. Now as I open drawers, I see the clothes I have not worn in over a year, the things I forgot I even had brought with me as I contemplate what can make the trip and what will be left behind.

There is definitely a feeling of sadness as I wrap this long and flexible four-year journey. I started in Southern Africa with Young Adults and Global Mission and journeying through Tanzania hoping to continue the program. Then when YAGM Southern Africa was finished I went to Kenya. Serving as the Lead Pastor to Nairobi International Lutheran Congregation was an in-person job, until myself and many others serving overseas were brought home for Covid 19. I have continued to serve in a long-distance capacity, but this will end July 15<sup>th</sup>.

No one could have predicted my last four years, and no one could have predicted our last year and a half. Yet amidst all of the switches and the unexpected, the constant has always been your love and support. There was love and support from the people and churches we worked with in all these countries. But the

continued love and support from congregations like yours was of great importance. And I know I was not the great communicator, but I promise you, your support was felt. There are churches in Africa giving thanks for the ELCA and all her members. I know this, because I have brought greetings on our behalf to churches and leaders in five different countries over these last four years. I have been given hospitality because of the long-standing relationships our church has created. There were many who came before me and I trust more will come after me, which will continue to serve the ELCA, but also the greater
