

Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder

This year in confirmation class we are studying the stories of the Bible. And where do we start, but at the beginning, with creation, which we did a couple weeks ago.

And there we read about the days of creation, and the creation of humankind.

"So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them;" (Genesis 1:27)

In Matthew 22:15-22, some of the temple authorities ask Jesus, "Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor or not?" Jesus asked them for the coin that was used to pay the tax.

Jesus asked them whose head and title were on the coin. They answered reality much bigger than Caesar's that it was the emperor's image. Jesus responded, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's and to God the things that are God's." (Matthew 22:21)

As I read that text, the story of the creation of humankind came to mind. In God's image we were created. We all bear the mark of God.

When coins are made, they are stamped with an image. We are also stamped with an image – the image of God.

In addition, at our baptism, we are marked with the cross of Christ. We can't see that image, but it's there, and can never be erased.

The significance of the image is the same as a seal: it is a marker of a grander meaning.

Caesar might have an empire, but God created the cosmos. We are brought back to Genesis and the creation of all that there is. It is a empire.

God put God's stamp on the earth by making humanity in the image and likeness of God's very self. Our very existence, everything that we are, belongs to the one whose image it bears.

Coins are made in the image of Caesar, and so they belong to him.

Humans are made in the image of God, so they belong to God.

Jesus calls them (and us) to remember who we are: to remember whose we are. We are children of God. Created by God. Created in the image of God. Created to be a sign of God's presence in this world. Charged to see that our whole lives give witness to the creative and renewing work God is seeking to do in this world.

We are called to return our whole lives in faithfulness: every action, every word, every decision, every relationship, every moment to be pleasing to the one who makes it all possible.

With His answer, Jesus invites us to boldly live in Caesar's world while bearing witness to the image of whom we belong, God.







Agenda reviewed, no additions

Devotions: Pastor Kristine led devotions from Psalm 145.

Secretary Report: Minutes from June Council Meeting reviewed. No changes submitted.

Motion by Jon Hanson, second Cory Heinrich to approve the secretary's report as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurers Report: Pastor Kristine – \$7,000 was borrowed from Gifts & Memorials in August. Giving for the year is \$10,000 ahead of last year.

Deacons Report: Char Strand – Discussion about God's Work Our Hands Sunday – looking for ideas on how to improve and increase attendance. New members – everyone can invite people to join. National Youth Gathering, Summer 2024 – getting the word out, there is a promotional video to watch.

Trustees Report: Cory Heinrich -Chimes are still in progress. Received a quote, and it will be reviewed before they are ordered. Ottertail Power will assist with the installation. New utility Rally Day was September 10: Balloon shed will be delivered next Thursday. It will have a gravel base. The old one will be cleaned out and demolished. A company has been contacted to help with water issues, offer ideas and quotes to remedy the problem. They have already offered many suggestions and we may be able to handle the jobs

with workers within the congregation. Josh Vetter and Ray Trager looked at a spot on the roof that may be contributing to the problem. Trustees will monitor the situation during the upcoming rain that is predicted. Mark Molden is working on the board on the wall behind the altar.

Board of Education Report: Pastor Kristine – Vacation Bible School (VBS) was held in August. Sunday School has started.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Kristine

Worship attendance: better attendance in September. Attendance: from 36 to 89 (Rally Day) in last month. Online worship is still 80-130 per Sunday.

Lakeside worship:
