Is It In The Bible? Holy Week Version

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 13 this year. These verses from the Bible summarize Holy Week.

"Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord - the King of Israel!" (John 12:13)

On Palm Sunday we observe Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem where the crowds waved palm branches and sang Hosanna to the redeemer king. It is a joyful celebration. Hundreds of people come out to see Jesus. The irony of the day is that just five days later the crowds would cry for the execution of Jesus.

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13:34)

On Maundy Thursday we remember the last meal Jesus ate with

his disciples who had followed him. At this Last Supper, Jesus instituted the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Jesus came as the servant king. And on this night, he washes the feet of his disciples, the ultimate symbol of servanthood.

The word Maundy comes from the Latin word that means "to give, to entrust, or to order." Jesus gives his last mandate: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35)

Jesus knows his life will soon end. He gives his last will and testament before he dies to let his followers know how they should live.

Then Jesus takes his disciples out to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray with him. Later in the evening Jesus is arrested and brought to trial. The crowd yells "Crucify him! Crucify him!" (John 19:6) Jesus is sentenced to crucifixion on Good Friday.

In contrast to the crowds who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem the previous Sunday, most of his followers have now deserted him.

He is taken away to be crucified. There he hangs alone on the cross.

Finally, it is over. "It is finished." Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit." (John 19:30)

He was laid in a borrowed tomb. There he was, dead in the grave, along with the hopes of his followers.

Everybody, including his disciples, thought it was over. Because dead people stay dead, right?

But that's not the end of the story. There is more. We all know how it ends.



Group 2, chairpersons, Jim/ Paulette Anderson, Judi Bohm, Barb Dale and Lorrie Spray, is next for funeral serving.



Lac qui Parle Conference

Lac qui Parle Conference **Assembly**

The Lac qui Parle Conference assembly was held February 23 at Kviteseid. Our conference stretches from Ortonville to Dawson and east to Maynard and consists of 28 churches and two nursing homes.

Judi Bohm, Michelle Ascheman, Gavin Ascheman, Nancy Streed, Rich Isder, Bryan and Talia Schuerman and Pastor Kristine attended from Kviteseid. We had more people attend than any other congregation!

We heard a report from Pastor Don McKee on Heritage Haven, a transitional housing project in Montevideo. Members approved sending \$3,000 from conference funds to this project.

Pastor Don McKee gave a Synod Council Report. The council is working on trying to get more pastors through training. There are 350 pastoral openings in the state of Minnesota. Last year, 126 students graduated from the eight ELCA to help out.

Pastor Mort Meyenburg talked about the synod lay ministry classes that she coordinates for Region 3, which is Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota.

Pastor Don McKee gave an update on our companionship with the Southeastern Diocese in South Africa. Our conference is matched with the KwaNodwengu Circuit. Four people were planning to travel to South Africa in May but due to schedule conflicts, the trip was canceled. Our conference sponsors 30 students in South Africa to go to school. The cost is \$250/student for

a year for two uniforms, room and board and supplies. Funds for the scholarships come from the conference treasury which is supported by the conference churches.

Carla Johnson gave the WELCA report. The Lac qui Parle Conference spring gathering will be held April 22 at Our Savior's in Montevideo. The synod women's gathering will be held May 3 at Vinje in Willmar. Women are welcome to participate in events even if their congregation does not have an organized WELCA.

Gwen Arneson reported on plans for the synod assembly.

The following conference officers were elected: Pastor Mort Meyenburg as conference dean, Ed Delf as chair, Karin Moen as treasurer, Carla Johnson as secretary.

Excerpts from Bishop Dee Pederson's 2024 Annual Report - Part 3

So we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.

Romans 12:5

Members One of Another

Praise God, no one is a Christian alone! We were baptized into the body of Christ. We know the truth of the words of St. Paul, that "if one of us suffers, all suffer together, and if one rejoices, all rejoice together." As our culture and the church are changing, I give thanks for the gift of the partnerships we have as an ELCA synod. These partnerships expand our impact and include:

- colleges & seminaries, campus ministries, advocacy, tackling world hunger, and global partners like LDR & LWR:
- our Mission Developments -House of Grace in Montrose and Reborn Lao Lutheran in Waite Park, and strategic ministry Paz y Esperanza in Willmar – powerful examples of evangelism;
- the accompaniment partnership we share with our Companion Church – the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa. This past June our Synod Assembly was blessed by the presence of Presiding Bishop Nkosinathi Myaka and Diocesan Board Chair Mr. Mkhize. We have much to learn from our friends in the South Eastern Diocese. I ask you to hold our global companions in prayer as they continue to proclaim the Gospel in challenging circumstances,

- and yet with deep faith and always – joy and praise to God.
- our global partners of the Ev. Lutheran Church in Jordan & the Holy Land, where I was able to visit two years ago with the Conference of Bishops. I met many of our Lutheran church members and the pastors of our 6 Lutheran congregations who are proclaiming the Gospel in an impossible time. They are surviving with steadfastness and persistence, and most of all, ask for your prayers for the situations in which they live today.

Numbers Together

Reports tell us how our life together is going. Even though our own congregation may not feel the effects of changes in a congregation sota Synod Assembly will be held on the other side of the synod, we are in this together "for better or worse" because we are one in Christ.

The most recent statistical summary for congregations comes from the annual reports completed for 2023. There are 228 congregations in the SW MN Synod; 177 filed an annual report.

Baptized members across the synod decreased from 2022 to 2023. But other numbers were up: average weekly worship on-site and online, and average attendance per congregation on-site and online. (The full report can be found on the synod website under congregations/ annual congregation meetings)

Those membership figures may reflect the changed attitudes people place in the importance of "membership" in organizations and specifically, in the institutional church. Yet notice how they also represent how people are slowly emerging to attend worship in per-

son and online as we live out being a both/and church – both in the room and online. Online worship is being accomplished by many congregations with technology as available as the phones we hold in our hands. St. Paul knew that the Good news of Jesus Christ is to be shared. Thank you for proclaiming it near and far.
